





This Latch is readily applied to doors of any thickness. The hole is $1\frac{5}{8}$ inches in diameter upon the *inside*, and $\frac{3}{4}$ inch *outside*. When the cylinder is in place, the Bar "B" is cut off so that when placed in the slot in the cylinder it shall reach 1-16 inch beyond the surface of the door, and thus enter the slot in the lock plate. The screws are reduced to the same length as the Bar. When run in flush they draw the Escutcheon firmly up to the wood, so that the cylinder is effectually supported. It remains only to fasten the case and the strike by the proper screws.


The Bar "B" enters slots deep enough to permit a fair margin of *end motion*, so that in this important particular, which mechanics will appreciate, this Latch is easier to put on than its rivals.

As may be observed from the design of the key, the essential parts of the cylinder are placed as far removed as possible from the face of the door and from view from the outside. The Cylinder "A" contains six rotating disks or tumblers, having in their outer edges notches that may be brought into line by the proper key. The whole circumference of each disk being available for notches, there is no difficulty in making as many combinations as may be required, so that *no two sets of keys will be found alike*, unless made to order.

As most other Latches and Locks are constructed, it is well known that they may be "picked" by any contrivance that will bring a strain upon the key hub or upon the bolt, and then by picking up the tumblers in turn. This theory of picking is not applicable to this Latch, because the key hub and tumblers all rotate freely, so that a strain cannot be brought upon them.

A number of experts having tested the security of this Latch, we are confident that it will be generally recognized as far more secure than any of its present competitors for favor.

By using the Special Escutcheon, Nos. 690, 691 and 692 may be applied to wood as thin as $\frac{1}{2}$ inch; and 693, 694, 695 to wood from $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches up.

No extra charge is made for the Special Escutcheon, when ordered with the Latch in place of the regular one.



A Reverse Bevel Strike Plate is furnished, free of extra charge, when ordered with the Latch in place of the regular strike. Thickness of the door should be given, when special strike is ordered.

"CHAMPION" STORE DOOR DEAD LOCKS.

6-Lever, Upright Rim.

Adjustable to right or left hand doors, from 1½ to 3 inches thick. Operated by Key from outside, and Knob from inside the door. Case, Japanned Iron, 2½ x 4 inches; Bolt, Bronze, 2 x ½ inch.

The favor accorded to this Lock is due not alone to its own positive security, but as much to the fact, that the Key can be withdrawn only when the lock is locked, thereby insuring against the common error of taking the Key out unintentionally at the wrong position. Upon entering the door, the bolt can be unlocked by a turn of the Knob, as has long been usual with Night Latches.







The "Champion" Locks admit of the application of the *Master-key* to an extent unknown in others, and without reducing their security to any considerable extent, giving them a great advantage over competitors. *A set of any required number, even such as are adapted to a variety of purposes about one establishment, may all be strictly non-interchangeable as to their special keys, and at the same time be fitted to a Master-key that will unlock all in the set.*

The *price* of Master key fitting is \$4.00 per dozen in addition to list price of the Locks. This includes *one* Master-key for each set. Any number of locks, from 2 to 1,000 or more, may be in a set. They are a great convenience in Dwellings, Offices, Factories, Libraries, Laboratories, Gymnasiums, etc.

A *Master-keyed set* may include Locks for Drawers, Closets, Desks, etc., as well as Night Latches, thus enabling the proprietor to control all with a single key, while his subordinates have their special keys only. Such sets may be increased, from time to time, as occasion requires, until they reach their limit.





The above cut shows the features of Chest Locks, Nos. 600 to 608.



But the valuable principles of security that had been so well proven in our "CHAMPION" LOCKS were available, and we were so fortunate as to patent a very simple and easy construction, which any person can use and understand without calling for the aid of an expert.

We printed a few words of explanation (placed with each lock), being exceedingly careful to adjust every one correctly, and to guarantee good work throughout.

The result exceeds our best expectations.

From the small Cash Box Lock, with which we began, have been developed a variety, already the most complete of the kind to be seen in any country, and finding a demand in every important market wherever they have been intelligently shown.

These Locks are strong, reliable, easily fitted, not subject to disorders, and present a handsome, highly finished appearance.

Each must be opened upon 3 of its dial numbers, which the owner may readily change. The chances of opening without previous knowledge of the Combination do not exceed one in a million.

The time required in fitting is not greater than for common locks. The dial marks and figures are especially clear and distinct. They are unlocked in a fraction of the time required to open an ordinary safe.

When orders do not specify the thickness of the wood the Locks sent will be for wood of the standard thickness given.









FROM OUTSIDE THE DOOR it is to be unlocked by turning the Dial, as in opening an ordinary safe, but in less time, as this lock is more simple. It is necessary to turn once only to each of the three numbers of the combination. This will require light. It is not possible to unlock from the outside in the dark. But there are many inside, OFFICE, HALL, CLUB-ROOM, GYMNASIUM and CLOSET doors, where a light is available. In many such places this lock is preferable to an ordinary latch, even without taking into account its smaller cost wherever a number of "extra" keys would otherwise be used.

The Dial is very clearly marked and handsomely Nickel-Plated. If preferred, the Dial can be Finished in Bronze, without extra cost.

DESCRIPTION.

The smaller part of the Cylinder, A, is screwed into the ring R, on the outer face of the door. The spindle is then put in, and the plate, U, of the latch case is laid against the inner face of the door. The screws, CC, secure this plate to the cylinder, A. The Lock is connected with the Latch by the bar B, which, with the screws, CC, are adjustable in length to the thickness of any door.

For those who so order, this lock will be mounted so as to be operative upon a suitable block of wood. For this the extra charge is 25 cents.

Each lock is accompanied by complete trimmings and printed directions for fitting and setting the combination. A large number of different combinations may be made by the owner.

When required for a door opening *outward*, the thickness of the door should be given with the order, so that a *special strike plate* may be sent, differing from the one shown in the illustration on page 18.
